Skipper Ryan Turner reports "After a tough and disappointing first day, the Reserves entered the second day of their match needing quick wickets. However, Parnell's plans unravelled as the Suburbs batsmen showed strong application in their task and reached 159 for the loss of no further wickets. Light drizzle forced the players from the field and upon clearing Suburbs declared.

Parnell needed to bat the rest of the day if they had any chance of salvaging the match. This got off to a disappointing start as both openers fell early to leave Parnell wallowing at 2/18. Things improved somewhat thanks to a spirited partnership between J. Pike and C. Barnes. Showing the value in playing straight and leaving well, the two managed to push Parnell to 59 before J. Pike fell. From here things quickly went from bad to worse as Parnell began to collapse. N. Gloag (batting on an injured ankle and with a runner) and T. Urry displayed commendable character in attempting to halt the fall. However, one over before tea, Parnell lost their last wicket to be all out for 92 – a very unsatisfactory result.

Needing 85 to win, Suburbs momentum was halted by the onset of further drizzle which again forced the players from the field. When they returned, Suburbs needed 5 an over to achieve an outright victory. Despite the wet conditions, the opening pair of J. Mar and T. Urry bowled well to reduce Suburbs to 4/59. Result – King's College won by 9 wickets

A momentous victory for King's College, the National Title holder. This follows the award a week ago by NZ Cricket to Simon Hickey, the King's captain, of the Gillette Player of the 2010/11 Season.

Match report from the King's College website: "King's College secured an emphatic victory in the 2011 Auckland qualifying competition for the Gillette Cup, thus earning an opportunity to defend their 2010 national title. The final was hosted by the Howick/Pakuranga Club who produced a decent wicket which offered rewards for accurate bowling as the occasional delivery was prone to keep low. The outfield was in excellent condition. Preparing the ground cannot have been easy after recent rain. Both umpires were appreciated and had excellent games.

St Kentigern won the toss and chose to bat. Harrison Nash and Ben Horne opened the attack for King's. Batsmen soon realised that they would be tested but, apart for one squandered chance at slip off Harrison Nash, they batted sensibly. After 17 runs had been added Ben Horne made a breakthrough in the eighth over and thereafter wickets fell at regular intervals. Harrison nabbed the next one when Travis Sherlock fenced at a rising delivery only to touch it to Tom Donnelly. In his next over he gained the prized scalp of the St Kentigern captain, Reve Anstis, who sliced one to Cameron Gibbons at backward point (23-3). Two runs later Michael Haddleton induced an error from Nick Kelly who prodded one to Harrison Nash at cover. With two prime batsmen dismissed without scoring St Kentigern were in deep trouble. Simon Hickey joined the attack and pressure was maintained. He snuffed out a partial recovery by trapping Matt Ellis in front and then a sharp slip catch by Mark Chapman removed the potentially explosive Harry Lyford for no score (50-6). The first boundary of the innings came in the 19th over and the next was a six off a Simon Hickey full toss by Devon Jones. Simon gained immediate revenge by having an attempted repeat caught comfortably by Luke Williamson at mid-off. Simon's fourth and final wicket came a few runs later with another easy LBW decision. Drinks were taken with St Kentigern on 70-8 after 34 overs. Harrison Nash returned and began with a wide but four balls later the innings was over thanks to another Mark Chapman catch and a final stumps hitting delivery. All the bowlers had bowled well, Simon Hickey in particular. He conceded 10 runs in two deliveries and his other 58 deliveries captured four wickets and conceded just 7 runs. Harrison Nash with 4 victims, including the captain, only gave away 14 runs.

St Kentigern must have been demoralised by their batting performance. When Nick Kelly's fourth delivery was fiercely swept to the boundary it seemed certain that it would not be their day. The opening partnership between Ben Horne and Cameron Gibbons put on 34 runs, many of which were extras. Simon Hickey survived one early scare but then he and Cameron put St Kentigern to the sword. Two massive sixes over mid-wicket by Simon Hickey sealed the victory which came in the 15th over. King's can now look forward to travelling to Lincoln in early December for the Gillette Finals."

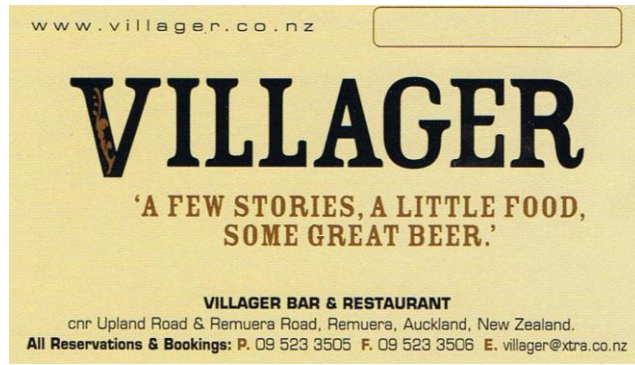
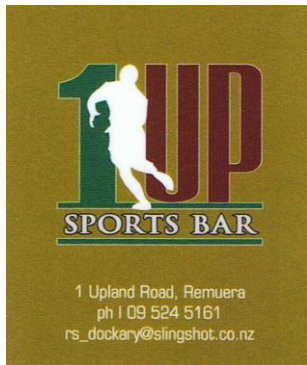
